PRINCIPAL'S REMARKS

- There are a number of staff changes for the term including pre-retirement leave for 2 members of the teaching staff.
- The results of the external examinations which had been completed at the end of the last academic year:
- CCSLC 76% of students had achieved Mastery; 24% had achieved Competence.
- CSEC, CAPE Unit 1 and Cape Unit 2 – pass rates were 94.4%, 98.2% and 99.5% respectively.
- There were 11 Barbados Scholarship and 5 Barbados Exhibition winners; plus 2 non-Barbadian students who were not awarded Barbados Scholarship and Exhibition. 2 students had been awarded the Aubrey Collymore Scholarship and 2 had been awarded scholarships to Dollar Academy in Scotland.
- 19 students are on track for Barbados Scholarships in 2018 and 16 students are on track for Barbados Exhibitions

 92 persons visited 14 cities over 19 days during the Foreign Language Department's summer European Tour.
